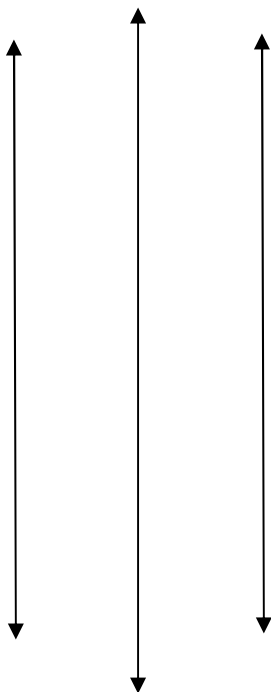

2. Academic Progress:

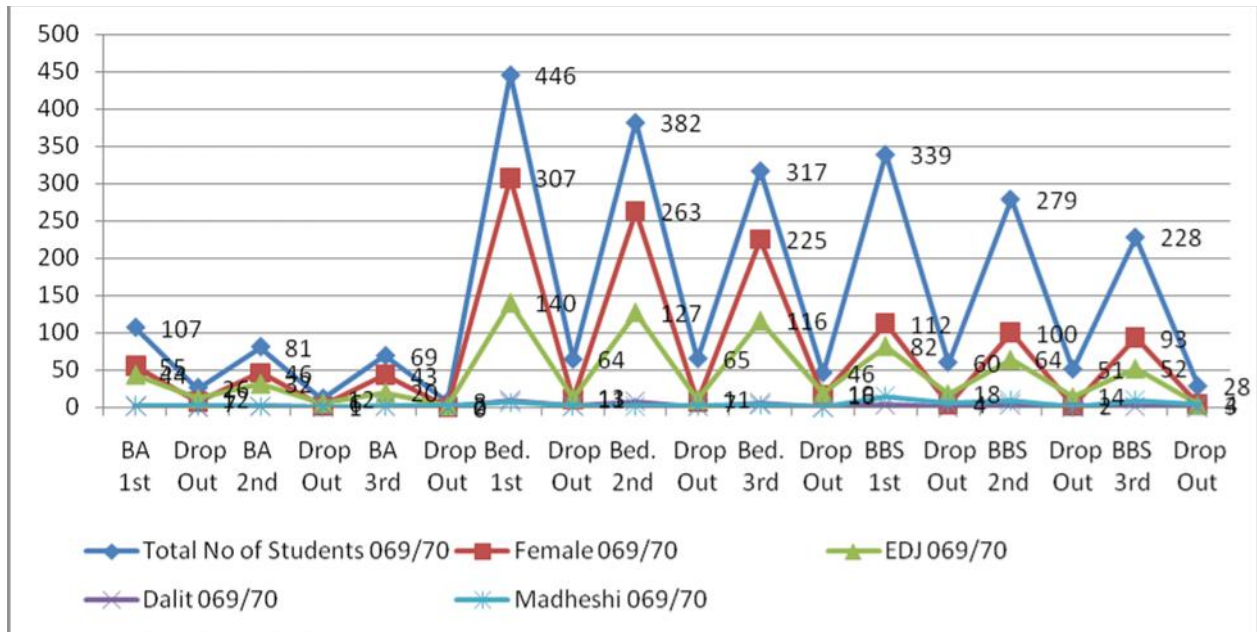

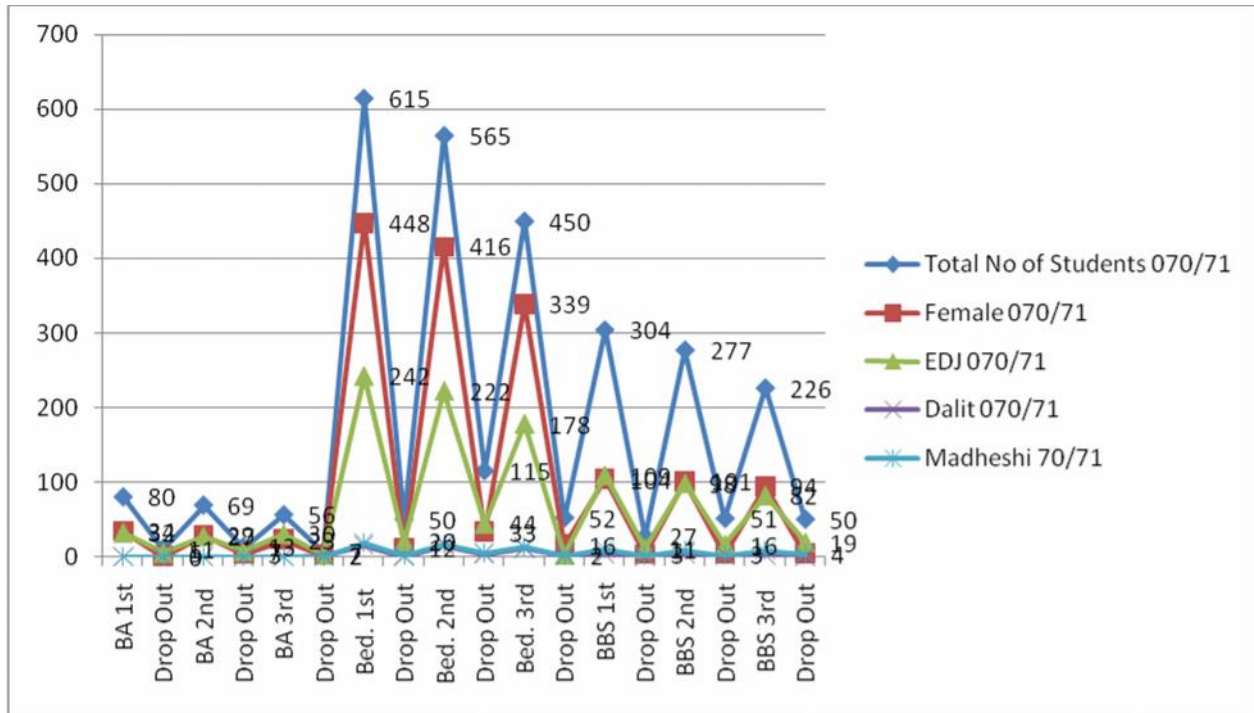

Bachelor Enrollment and Dropout Trend of Academic Year 2069/070



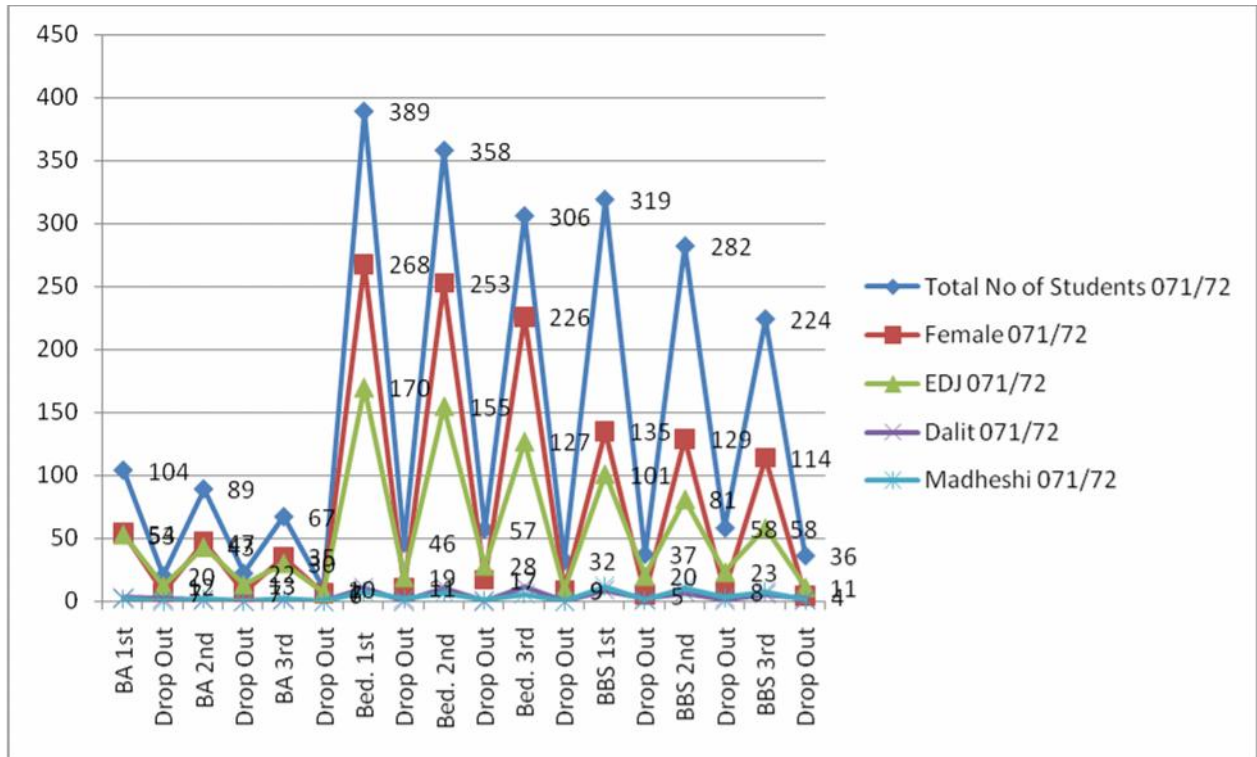

Bachelor Enrollment and Dropout Trend of Academic Year 2070/071



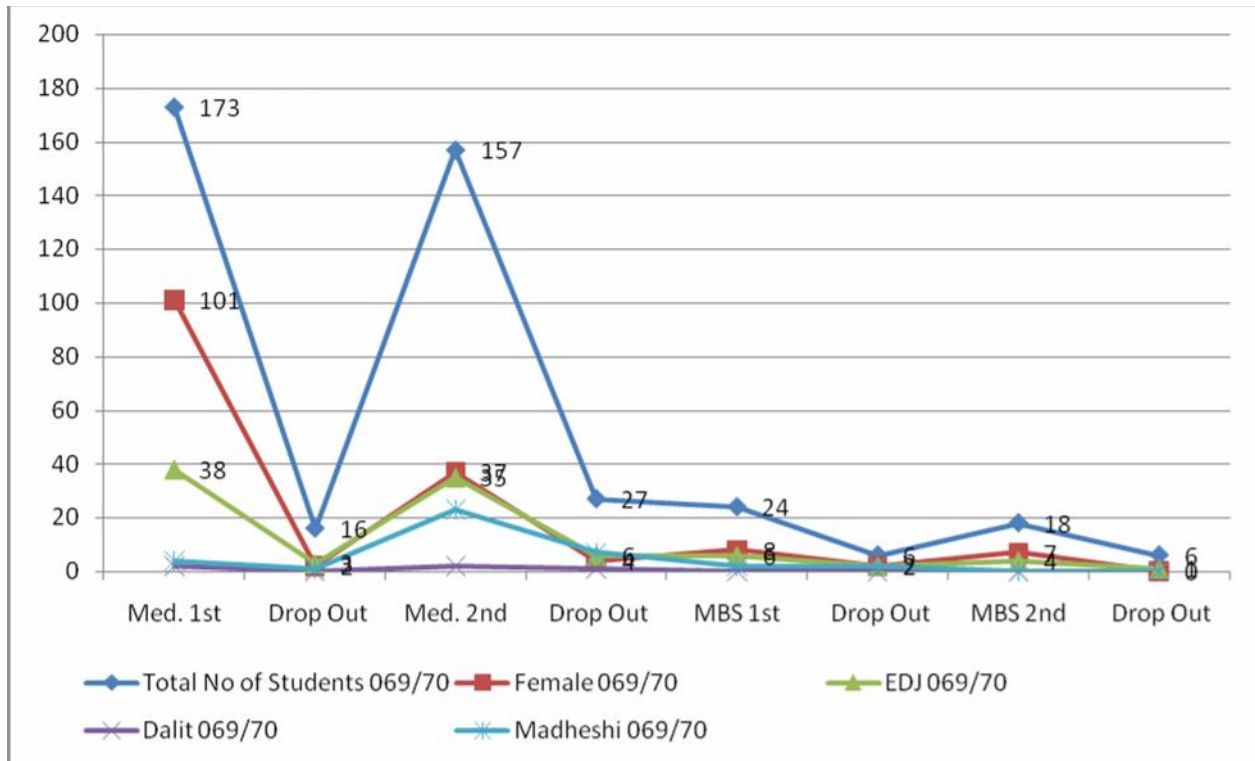

But dropout trend increased 11.83% to 19.12% in B.A. programme, on the other hand BBS programme dropout trend increases 18.43% from 19.86% on the other hand. In B.Bed programme dropout percentage decreases 19.28% to 13.31% it shows charming of student goes to B.Ed programme so enrollment students decrease from B.A. and BBS programme.

Bachelor Enrollment and Dropout Trend of Academic Year 2071/072



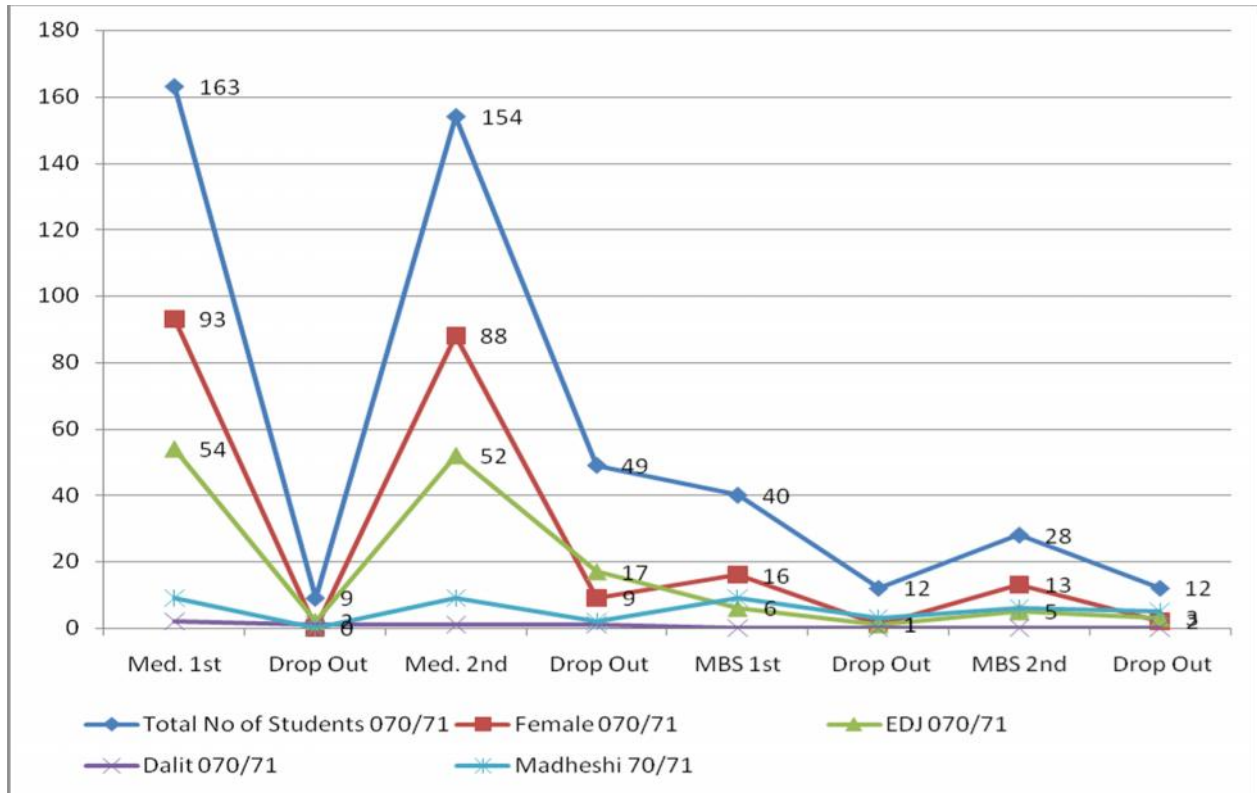

Master Enrollment and Dropout Trend of Academic Year 2069/070



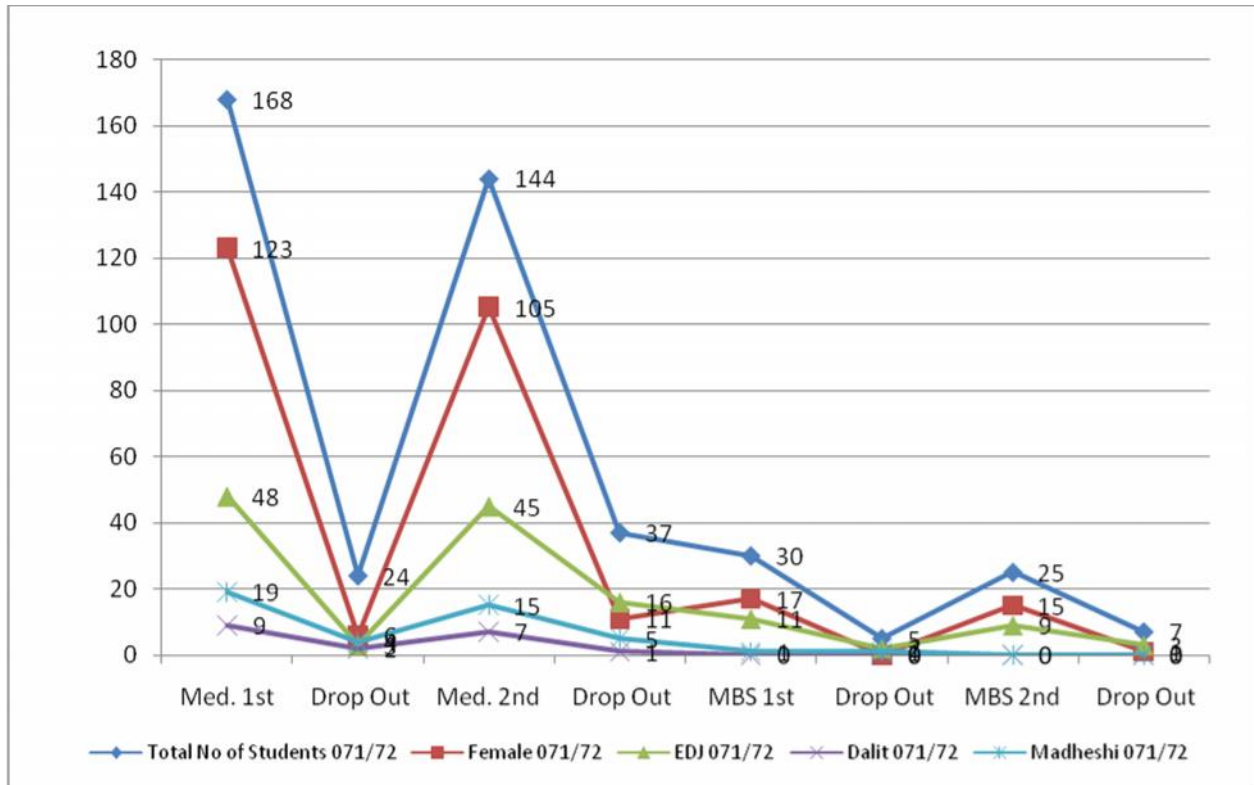

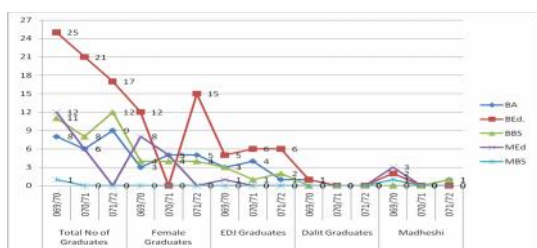

2.5. Educational Pedagogy

Admission Process

Having located at the centre of State no-1 (Itahari), JMC has been the attraction among the districts (Sunsari, Morang, Saptari, Khotang, Sankhuwasabha, Dhankuta, Terathum, Taplejung, Okhaldhunga, Solukhumbu, Bhojpur) from the point of view of quality education in affordable fee structure. JMC is aware about the attention to be paid for the admission procedure. So, it tries to find out healthy ways to attract good students to its academic programs. Basically the Campus organizes department-wise meetings to prepare the procedures of the admissions. The Campus has its website and annually revised prospectus. The advertisement through media, social marketing and institutional approach are the basic ways to accumulate the students in the Campus. The students submit the forms with their academic records and attend for the entrance examination in the stipulated date. Along with the publication of result, the merit students are invited for the admission with the certificates and circumstantial need of parents' attendance. Interview of the students is regarded to be essential for the attitude and aptitude test. On its course of action, it has devised ways to encourage students from disadvantaged groups and women to apply for its courses inclusively. After the students get admitted, they are provided orientation to inform them about the Campus, the courses, library use, faculties setup, pedagogy, code of conduct and policy and procedure.

Teaching Learning Process

Excellent planning and effective implementation can only lead to success. Regarding the value, JMC emphasizes that the planning is most important in the teaching and learning process. Here, the teaching and learning is systematized through the academic calendar and the lesson plan developed at the beginning of each session. Every academic year starts with an orientation

program for the new comer. In addition, class teachers are assigned the new classes with the major responsibility of counseling the students in shaping their academic goals. Besides, the campus has always tried to improve its teaching and learning experience through new methods that complement the traditional lecture methods like interactive method, presentation, audio visual aids etc. Furthermore, about 64% of our teachers are full timers on subject-wise basis, which indicates that the students can learn to meet the needs in their mutually assigned time. They are available even for post-classroom discussion. This has helped the students understand things that they may not understand in the classroom, and also can develop new relationships.

The departments make the faculties responsible to form annual teaching planning and implement in accordance with the academic calendar of the years. In spite of the occasional external obstacles, the Campus manages to harmonize the academic calendar with syllabi. The Campus has managed log book in the office to be filled by the faculty every day. More over the Campus has managed to run classes even in vacations to have effectiveness in teaching learning activities. AQMC takes formal initiatives of these activities. The Campus also monitors the students' overall performance periodically in the procedures of conducting internal examinations and assignments, analyzing and interpreting the result, analyzing the board examination result, holding meeting of IQMC and evaluating the performance of departments and displaying the records through diagrams charts.

Our Faculty

JMC has a dynamic faculty body of 63 members, occupying 40 full time teacher and 3 guest lecturer from TU and PU. The Campus has its own provision of appointing lectures on the basis of Campus statute. During the process the CMC body decides about fallen vacancy, in coordination with the departments and administration. Then, the Campus administration announces for the vacant post, and the candidates are invited for a written examination, followed by interview and demo classes. Besides, we are equally aware about the quality of the candidates. The Campus has different programs for faculty development by encouraging its lecturers to attend seminars, workshops, and refresher courses. Faculties get paid leave when they go to attend such programs. The Campus also provides study leave and seed money for research scholars who want to pursue their study further.

Moreover, our faculty is well recognized for the contributions made in the communities. Our teachers have been members of subject committee in PU and TU. Besides, they have been providing consultant services to the different local governmental body like VDC, Municipality and INGOs and NGOs programs. The Campus has RMC unit with the objective to activate the teachers in research programs in order to make the teaching and learning complementary and evolving onwards.

Evaluation Process and Reforms

JMC is with the philosophy that, no teaching is possible when there is no learning and research, and it is not research unless it gets practical implications. Being with this philosophy, the campus has adopted the system of teachers' evaluation. This evaluation is made on the basis of teacher's regularity, punctuality, patience and his/her commitment to teaching, learning and research. The teachers' participation in extension activities, success of his lesson plan and students' feedback are the result indicators in his access towards the responsibilities. Students' feedback is received throughout the year on various issues informally. At the end of the sessions the campus officially collects feedback of students on teachers, administration and non-teaching staff. Besides, Peer evaluation is regarded as another significant system to help the faculties understand themselves better. Such mechanisms of appraisal helps the teachers understand their weaknesses and strengths.

In the Campus, the faculties of particular subject area hold interactions to acquire ways, solutions and strategies. This process has made possible to teach in the classes effectively. Our departments have sound coordination among the faculties in accessing and passing circulars. Our culture of sharing and learning is not limited within and among. Our faculties have voluntarily got their access to the different institutions and centers for promoting their academic as well as professional carrier which the students are indebted directly and indirectly.

In addition to the above, the students get participated in the internal examinations. The objective behind the examinations is to make evaluation about the students preparation for the final board examination. This process also helps the Campus to identify the weak students in subject wise basis, and to provide them remedial classes.

3. Physical Progress:

Physical condition is the bed rock of any institution to erect the foundation for additional structural adjustment in the modern era. Though JMC originated in the community school's infra structure years ago, it has its own area of 3-12-9.5 bigahas and approximately 3-0-0 bigahas woods area has been provided by local Woods Preservation Committee (Samudayik Ban Upabhokta Samuha). In which the Campus has been setting physical infrastructures. Recently, to make the plans rather effectively, the Campus has made master plan to complement the future requirements of the Campus.

3.1. Infrastructural Development:

In the period of about three decades Janata Multiple Campus has achieved significance achievement in its academic, administrative as well as physical and infrastructural area. As per

the detail and the ground reality sounds the Campus has three storied concrete buildings with 36 rooms for class room purpose. The rooms are well equipped with sophisticated desks and benches, metal lecture stands, electric ceiling fans and white board (Black boards were replaced by white boards with the initiation and financial aid of Teachers Association of JMC). For fresh drinking water facilities, The Campus has managed fresh drinking water in a heavy reserve tank with three tapes and two water jars in every three stories of the buildings. The Campus also has got a water reserve tank with four taps aided by Gurkha welfare service (GWS). In the Campus there are 14 toilets and urinals for 32 students at a time. 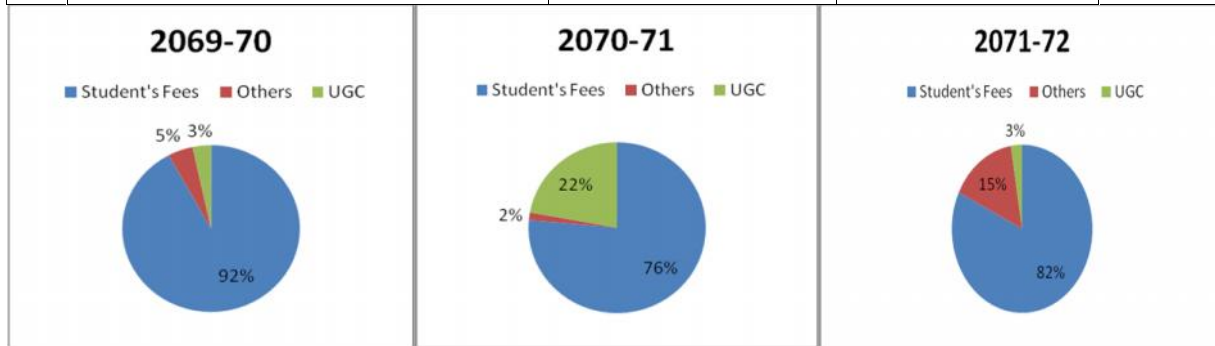

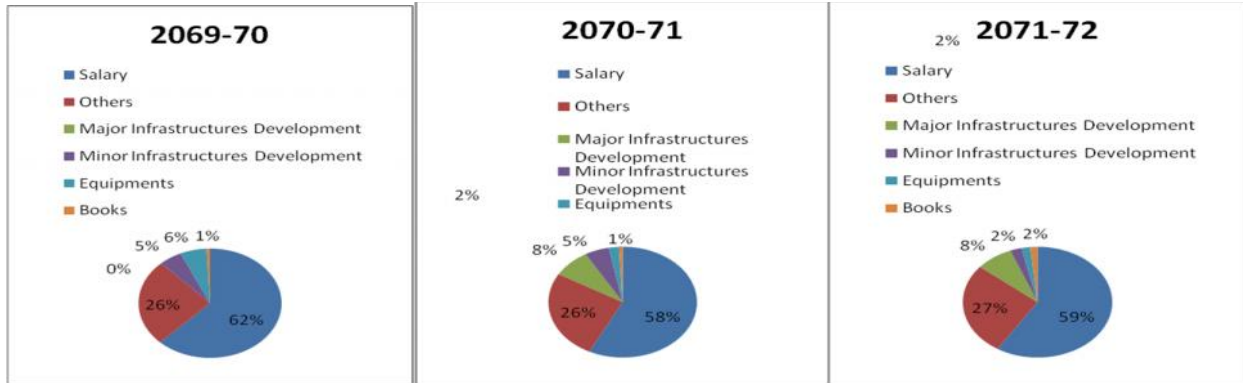

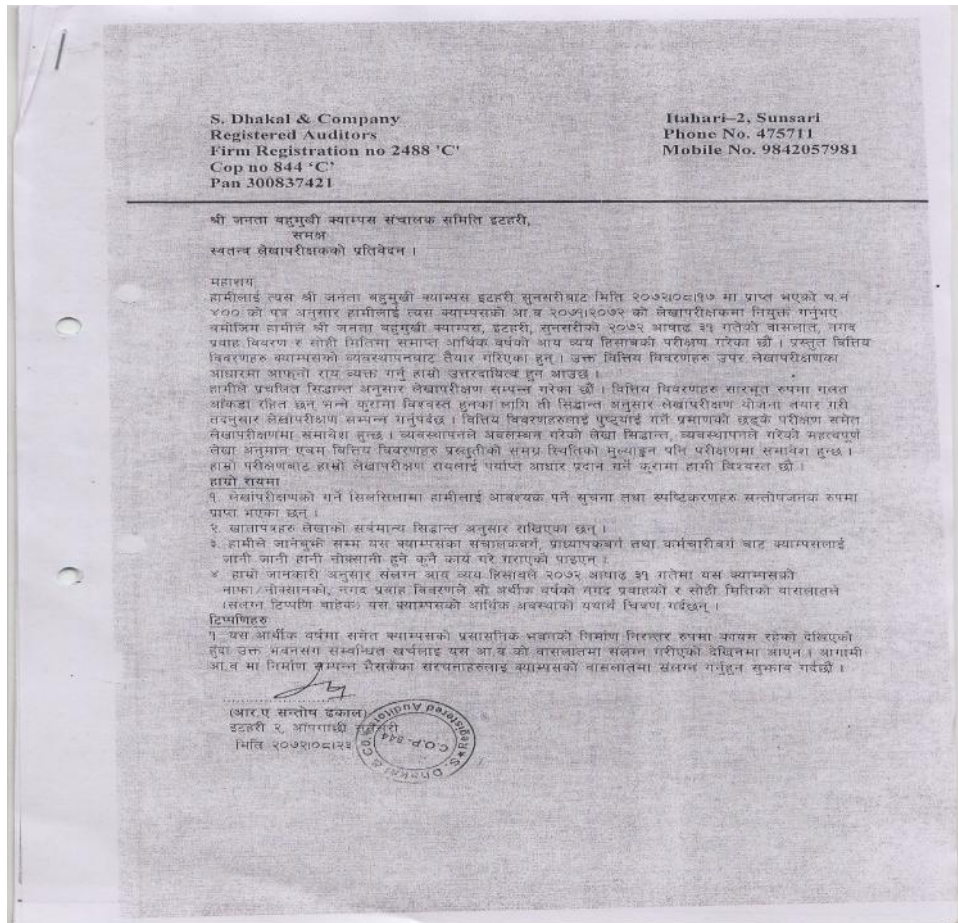

4.3. Audit Observations/Issues and Steps taken to mitigate the issues Raised by Audit Observations in the Last Fiscal Year.

The Campus has formal provision of Audit observations by Registered Auditor. In the last fiscal year the auditor, S. Dhakal and Company suggested basing on observations and issues to mitigate. The detail has been submitted here under.



Provision of Playground

The campus has enough playground. Student players of the Campus as well as the different clubs of football, Volley ball and Cricket use this multi-purpose play ground. Recently, the ground has been maintained to meet the moderate standard. So, this has been very good source for the Campus to develop social relationship with professional players, clubs, schools, corporate house and colleges.

Distribution of Scholarship

As per the statute of JMC there is a provision of accepting the funds from the donors in the forms of Reserve Fund and Scholarship Fund. In the very consequence there are different scholarship funds that the campus has been distributing to the talent, Pro-poor, disabled, orphan students of different faculties and levels on the basis of their performance and the judgment of Campus scholarship community.

Campus has also established Welfare Scholarship Fund which is distributed to 10 percent students of each class out of which 50% is distributed to the merit based students and 50% to the marginal group students like girls, poor, talent and disciplined, ethnic, disabled, dalit, etc.

Extracurricular Activities

This campus has been organising different extracurricular activities and programs inviting the students of neighboring HS Schools and Colleges and distributing awards and prizes every year. Such common activities are Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Kabadi, Cricket, Quiz, Oratory programs, etc. This year the program was organized in the first week of Falgun. These activities and programs help for the all round development of competitors of this locality.

Road management

There is a road made across the campus premise between the playground and campus building which is the shortcut way for the people of the community to use as link Kabyabatika area and East-West (Mahendra) Highway and Pachrukhi Hatiya.

Honor and Felicitation

Janta Multiple Campus has a great deal of respect to its stakeholders . On the occasion of the Program silver jubilee in 2070, the Campus awarded with certificate of honour and appreciation. Land donors, donors, scholarship fund providers, reserved-fund providers, council members, former campus chiefs, formers professors, lecturers, staff and students etc. are always regarded to be the great source of inspiration and guideline for the Campus.

Similarly, the campus has felicitated and awarded with certificate of appreciation to its Ph. D. holder professors: Prof. Dr. Badri Bishal Pokharel, former campus chief; Prof. Dr. Tanka Prasad Neupane and Prof. Dr. Kedar Prasad Poudel.

5.2.Society's Contributions for College :

Janta Multiple Campus, situated in the beautiful town Itahari, is running in 27th year with many ups and downs. The contribution of the community has great and incomparable to this campus to come in the present condition. Some conscious citizen of the society tried to establish a community based campus at Itahari in 2040 BS but their effort came to be successful and concrete only after 2045 BS when a meeting was conducted with the leadership of Ramesh Shrestha, President of District Panchayat then. After that the citizens of Itahari were motivated to contribute and donate either land or property. Some other people of Itahari also contributed to this campus by establishing scholarship fund. Land donated to the campus

This campus is donated by the land owners of the area where it is located, i.e. Itahari 5, Pachrukhi, and some land areas have been bought by the Campus. Now it has worth of $6-12-9\frac{1}{2}$ (six bigha, twelve kaththa, nine and a half dhur) land .It is all possible by the generous heart of many people of the community.

The list shows us that there are 21 people who have donated their land to this campus. The donated area of land is $3-12-9\frac{1}{2}$ (three bigha, twelve kaththa, nine and a half dhur). - To bring efficiency in teaching learning activities, the faculties are sent for energizing programs, organized by CDC and in the Campus level.
- To uplift the condition of teaching learning, the Campus has purchased multimedia, distributed laptops to the faculties and sophisticated lecture stands have been prepared and set to the class rooms.
- To reduce the existing drop out ratio, the Campus has activated The Students Support and Guidance Council to motivate the students for their devoted learning and performances.
- RMC has been formulated to continue the research works effectively along with the implications of the findings in the field of teaching-learning and aid to the community.
- In the Free ship Quota of the Campus esp. preference is given to the Female, EDJ, Dalit, Madheshi and Mushlim. The objective behind it is to motivate them for the formal education.

- ✚ Research and Management Cell is to be activated by setting a set in the required standard.
- ✚ To have some effectiveness in sustainable economic and financial development the Campus has planned to transform the Campus ground as mini stadium, Multi-purpose Seminar hall is to be made and recreation park is made by the side of Campus Woods area. The Campus has planned to use the above for commercial purpose too.
